Bay St. George South - Modifications to Piping For The Existing Twin Alternating Treatment System

Permission is hereby given for : the modification to the piping for the twin alternating strontium treatment system as shown on a drawing numbered 090620, sheet C-02 as received from Anderson Engineering Consultants Limited on October 27, 2017.

- This Permit does not release the Permit Holder from the obligation to obtain appropriate approvals from other concerned municipal, provincial and federal agencies.
- The Permit Holder must obtain the approval of the Crown Lands Administration Division if the project is being carried out on Crown
- This Permit is subject to the terms and conditions indicated in Appendices A and B (attached).
- It should be noted that prior to any significant changes in the design or installation of the proposed works, or in event of changes in ownership or management of the project, an amendment to this Permit must be obtained from the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment under Section 49 of the Water Resources Act.
- · Failure to comply with the terms and conditions will render this Permit null and void, place the Permit Holder and their agent(s) in violation of the Water Resources Act and make the Permit Holder responsible for taking any remedial measures as may be prescribed by this Department.

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APPENDIX A Terms and Conditions for Permit

Water & Sewer General

- Water pumped from excavations or work areas, or any runoff or effluent directed out of work sites, must have silt and turbidity removed by settling ponds, filtration, or other suitable treatment before discharging to a body of water. Effluent discharged into receiving waters must comply with the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations, 2003.
- 2. All operations must be carried out in a manner that prevents damage to land, vegetation, and watercourses, and which prevents pollution of bodies of water.
- Any areas adversely affected by this project must be restored to a state that resembles local natural conditions. Further remedial
 measures to mitigate environmental impacts on water resources can and will be specified, if considered necessary in the opinion of this
 Department.
- 4. All waste materials resulting from this project must be disposed of at a site approved by the Department of Service NL.
- The works proposed must satisfy the requirements of the latest applicable codes and standards, and be consistent with or otherwise address the design criteria set out in the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment publication Guidelines for The Design. Construction, and Operation of Water and Sewerage Systems, 2005, and as amended from time to time.
- 6. The work must be undertaken in strict compliance with the submitted documents and the latest version of the Municipal Water, Sewer and Roads Master Construction Specifications. A copy of all documents, including the Municipal Water, Sewer and Roads Master Construction Specifications must be available for viewing at the construction site office at all times.
- 7. Liaison is to be maintained with the Environmental Scientist representing the Drinking Water and Wastewater Section of this Department, during the construction and operation of the project. They shall be notified of the pre-construction and post-construction meetings so that they may attend, if deemed necessary. They can be reached at telephone (709) 637-2034.
- Officials of this Department may visit the project from time to time to ensure that work is carried out within the provisions of this
 Permit, and is not creating any environmental hazard.
- 9. Any changes in the approved works, or works other than those specified in the application, must be submitted, in writing, to this Department, and approved, in the form of an Amendment to this Permit, prior to any work.
- 10. Copies of this Permit, as well as any subsequent Amendments, must be provided to the contractor(s) who will be carrying out these works, and to the engineer's site representative.
- 11. The attached Completion Report (Appendix C) for Permit No. 9467 must be completed and returned to this Department upon completion of the approved works. Pictures must be submitted along with the completion report, showing the project site prior to and after development.
- 12. This Permit is valid for two years from the date of issue. Work must be completed by that date or the application and approval procedure must be repeated.
- 13. The drinking water system shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the Permit to Operate issued by this Department.
- 14. The Owner must update any drawings maintained of the drinking water system to reflect the modification or replacement of the works, where applicable.

Water Systems

- 15. All new waterlines and appurtenances shall be hydrostatically tested in accordance with the *Municipal Water*, *Sewer and Roads Specifications*.
- 16. All components, lubricants and chemicals provided shall be compatible for use with drinking water and shall meet the requirements of ANSI/NSF 60 Drinking Water Treatment Chemical Standard and ANSI/NSF 61 Drinking Water and System Component Standard and any other standard applicable to potable water.

17. All new lines and appurtenances must be disinfected by an approved method described in the latest edition of the AWWA C651 Standard for Disinfecting Watermains and using only chlorine products that meet the NSF 60 standard.

Special Conditions

18. After completing the modification to the piping on the twin alternating treatment system, the Local Service District shall initiate a water quality monitoring program to confirm Strontium levels are at or below the Guidance Value of 4.4 mg/l as established by Health Canada. The monitoring program shall consist of an initial test within 48 hours of start-up and one more test to be taken within the next 30 days. If the results of the monitoring program indicates an exceedence for Strontium above the Guidance Value then an alternative treatment system may be required to treat for Strontium. The results of the monitoring program must be reported to the regional Environmental Scientist as received.

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APPENDIX B Special Terms and Conditions for Permit

- 1. The Permit Holder and its agent(s), subcontractor(s), and consultant(s) shall keep all systems and works in good condition and repair and in accordance with all laws, by-laws, directions, rules and regulations of any governmental authority. The Permit Holder or its agent(s), subcontractor(s), or consultant(s) shall immediately notify the Minister if any problem arises which may threaten the structural stability of the systems and works, endanger public safety and/or the environment or adversely affect others and/or any body of water either in or outside the said Project areas. The Permit Holder and its agent(s), subcontractor(s), and consultant(s) shall be responsible for all damages suffered by the Minister and Government resulting from any defect in the systems and works, operational deficiencies/inadequacies, or structural failure.
- 2. The Permit Holder and its agent(s), subcontractor(s), and consultant(s) shall operate the said Project and its systems and works in a manner which does not cause any water related and/or environmental problems, including but not limited to problems of erosion, deposition, flooding, and deterioration of water quality and groundwater depletion, in or outside the said Project areas. The Permit Holder and its agent(s), subcontractor(s), and consultant(s) shall be responsible for any and all damages associated with these problems caused as a result of changes, deficiencies, and inadequacies in the operational procedures by the Permit Holder or its agent(s), subcontractor(s), or consultant(s).
- 3. If the Permit Holder or its agent(s), subcontractor(s), or consultant(s) fails to perform, fulfil, or observe any of the terms and conditions, or provisions of this Permit and/or Ministerial orders and guidelines, as determined by this Department, the Minister may, after providing ten (10) day notice to the Permit Holder, amend, modify, suspend or cancel this Permit in accordance with the Water Resources Act.
- 4. The Permit Holder and its agent(s), subcontractor(s), and consultant(s) indemnify and hold the Minister and Government harmless against any and all liabilities, losses, claims, demands, damages or expenses including legal expenses of any nature whatsoever whether arising in tort, contract, statute, trust or otherwise resulting directly or indirectly from granting this Permit, systems and works in or outside the said Project areas, or any act or omission of the Permit Holder or its agent(s), subcontractor(s), or consultant(s) in or outside the said Project areas, or arising out of a breach or non-performance of any of the terms and conditions, or provisions of this Permit by the Permit Holder or its agent(s), subcontractor(s), or consultant(s).
- 5. This Permit is subject to all provisions of the Water Resources Act and any regulations in effect either at the date of this Permit or hereafter made pursuant thereto or any other relevant legislation enacted by the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador in the future.
- 6. This Permit shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador.
