Significant Events

- Tropical Storm Gabrielle September 18, 2001
- Badger Flood February 15, 2003
- West Coast Flood March 31, 2003
- Stephenville Area Flooding– September, 2005
- Northeast Coast Flood– April, 2006
- Daniel's Harbour Landslides– April, 2007
- Tropical Storm Chantal August, 2007
- Gambo Flooding– July and August, 2008
- Trout River Landslides– June 2009
- Hurricane Igor– September 2010



IGOR – What Did It Mean?

- 125 municipalities reported damage
- 70,000 residents lost power
- > 100 road breakages
- 22 communities declared a State of Emergency
- > \$65 million in insurable damages
- > \$120 million in non-insurable damages
- 1978 personal claims
- One fatality Mr. Allan Duffett

Before the Event

- Disaster Plan
- Planned Development
- Properly Designed Infrastructure
- Infrastructure Maintenance
- Replace Deficient Infrastructure
- Impose Adequate Tax Structure

During the Event

- Take Appropriate Measures
- Declare a State of Emergency
- Address Life Safety Issues
- Ride It Out

After the Event

- Deploy Officials ASAP
- Assess Damage
- Assess Infrastructure Capacity
- Distribute/Receive Applications
- Reconcile to Assessment





