

# Waste Management Plan

**Project:** Multi-Use Trail Development (Crown Lands LTO 163080) **Proponent:** West Coast Cycling Association (WCCA)

## 1. Introduction

This plan outlines the generation, storage, transport, and disposal of wastes associated with the construction and operation of trail development on Crown Lands LTO 163080. In accordance with provincial guidelines, this project prioritizes waste reduction and proper management to minimize environmental impact.

## 2. Waste Identification and Management

As required by the guidelines, the following types of waste have been identified along with their management procedures:

- **General Construction Waste (Wood):**
  - **Generation:** Minimal scrap wood will be generated during trail construction.
  - **Management:** We do not use pressure-treated wood or plastics for construction. All scrap wood is removed from the site daily.
- **Domestic/General Refuse:**
  - **Generation:** Daily trash generated by staff/crew.
  - **Management:** All trash is removed from the site daily. No refuse is stored on-site overnight.
- **Hazardous Wastes (WDG/HW):**
  - **Generation:** The project does not produce used oil or other hazardous wastes of any kind.
  - **Management:** Since no hazardous waste is produced, no special transport or disposal measures for WDG/HW are required.

## 3. Equipment and Tool Storage

- All tools and equipment are removed from the site daily. There is no long-term storage of machinery or maintenance fluids on the site.

## 4. Contingency Plan

To address occurrences or emergencies that have the potential to impact the environment :

- **Spill Response:** Spill kits are available and ready on-site to address any accidental fluid leaks from equipment, even though no waste fluids are generated.
- **Fire Safety:** Fire extinguishers are present on-site at all times during work to manage fire risks.

## 5. Staff Training

Details regarding staff training relative to waste and safety include:

- All staff are trained in the safe handling of all equipment used on the project.
- Staff are instructed on the "carry in, carry out" policy regarding trash and scrap materials to ensure daily removal.
