

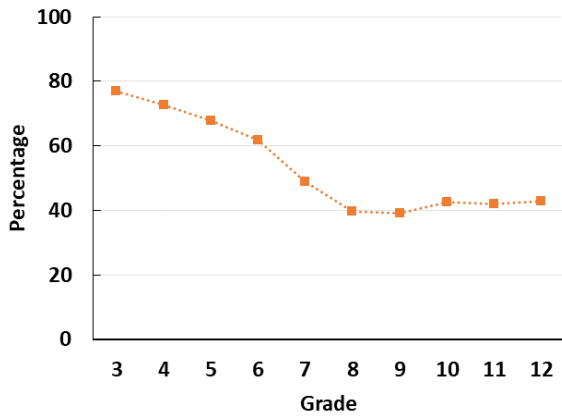

What percentage of student respondents reported a positive school climate?



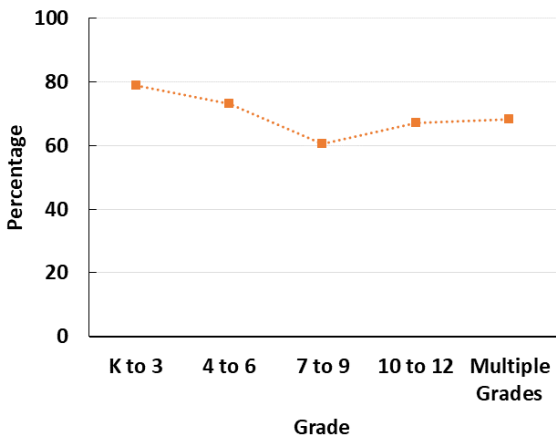

What percentage of teacher respondents reported a positive school climate?

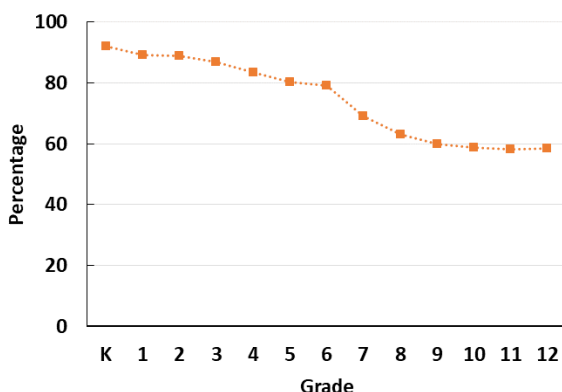

What percentage of family respondents reported a positive school climate?

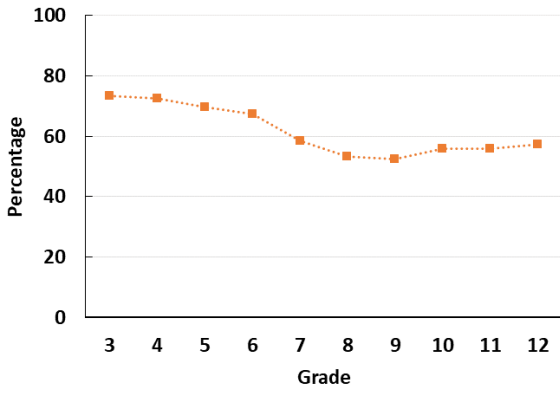

What percentage of student respondents reported a safe school environment?



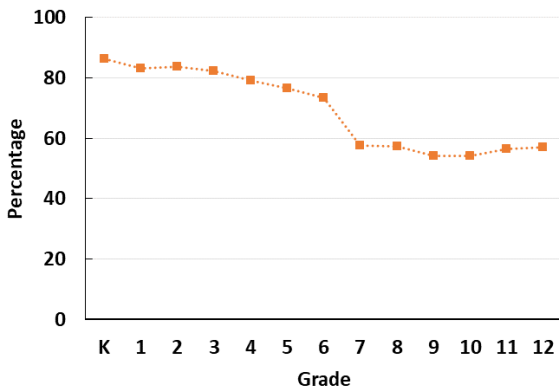

What percentage of family respondents reported a safe school environment?

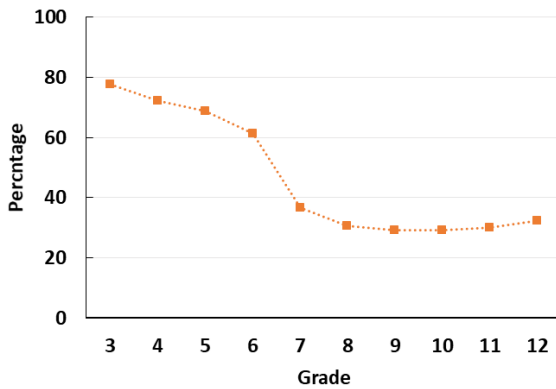

Data Collection Methodology

The data is collected using the School Development Surveys completed by students (Gr. 3-12), families, instructional staff, and non-instructional staff.

Response Rates: Grades 3-6: 86% Grades 7-12: 62% Instructional Staff: 80%* Family: 27%^

*The response rate for non-instructional staff is not available.

^Families with more than one child in a school may complete the survey once for the oldest child in that school.
