Cultural Connections K-12 Arts and Cultural Strategy

Music, drama, and visual arts, along with other forms of expression, help a culture to define its identity and explore its heritage. Cultural Connections, a provincial arts and cultural strategy for K-12 education, aims to increase the presence of cultural content in the school curriculum and foster links between artists and students in the school environment.

Through this integrated strategy,

- Newfoundland and Labrador history and culture will be affirmed as a key feature of the K-12 curriculum
- Students will develop a critical awareness of the role of the arts in creating and reflecting heritage
- Students, and those who witness their expression of the arts, will also come to respect the contributions of individuals and cultural groups to the arts, in local, national and international contexts, and will recognize the value of the arts as a record of human experience

As part of this strategy, a program was initiated to provide school libraries and classrooms with copies of published works by local authors and performers. These works address aspects of Newfoundland and Labrador history and culture.







This CD presents some different approaches to a few of Newfoundland and Labrador's more favourite folk songs. Also available is the songbook which includes melodies, lyrics and guitar chords for each song in the collection. This entertaining teacher resource that can be useful for comparing and contrasting different types of performance mediums.

All Around the Circle and We'll Rant and We'll Roar Tilt Hill Publishing Ltd.

These two songbooks provide the song melodies with guitar chords and arrangements in keys suitable to the average voice. They are a collection of some of the more popular songs of Newfoundland. A useful resource for the music teacher.

Vive La Rose Amber Music

This CD represents a vanishing breed of musician. Some of the tunes on this compilation may be recognized by different names, but in the constant evolving oral tradition. Emile Benoit titled some of the tunes with names he deemed suitable, whether it be for an event or a person. The music is essentially French but with a strong Scottish influence. This is owing to the fact that Emile comes from the Port-au-Port peninsula of Newfoundland which was populated by Bretons and Acadians from the 1820's on. A useful resource for demonstrating how musical styles evolve.






Native American Music in Eastern North America Written by Beverley Diamond





A useful resource for the music teacher in representing the various playing styles of traditional Newfoundland instruments such as the fiddle, accordion, guitar and bodhran, and for demonstrating, comparing and contrasting various forms in music. Rufus Guinchard: Fathers of the Newfoundland Fiddle, Volume 1 Pigeon Inlet Productions Ltd.

A collection of unique and indigenous Newfoundland music from one of Newfoundland and Labrador's music icons. Rufus Guinchard, who hails from the Northern Peninsula. He played fiddle music for dances all along the coast of the Northern Peninsula, all the while learning and retaining many of the old tunes played in these communities. This represents a legacy in the history of Newfoundland and Labrador traditional music that earned Rufus the title Father of the Newfoundland Fiddle.




