



This is a French immersion program designed for teenagers, regardless of their level of knowledge in French. Three weeks of language training, stimulating discoveries, and unforgettable encounters at *École internationale de français at Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières*. Dynamic French lessons every morning. In the afternoon, a variety of workshops to improve your skills: songs, dance, phonetics, theatre, environmental topics, etc. Diversified socio-cultural activities are also on the program!

Admission requirements

To be eligible, you must be a full-time Grade 9 student during the 2023-24 school year in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Courses

French courses allow you to improve your written and oral skills through interactive classroom activities, various teaching strategies and diverse oral and written assignments (discussions, role plays, story writing, movies, songs, newspaper articles, etc.). Courses are held from Monday to Friday, 3 hours a day.

Arrival and departure

Arrival

Students will be welcomed on Sunday before the beginning of the program; From 12p.m. to 10p.m.; in the [hall of the Albert-Tessier building](#).

Departure

The program ends after the closing ceremony on the last Friday. Departures are planned on Saturday and it is strongly recommended to leave in the morning.

Travel Guide

A system of travel guide ensures the safety of participants from their arrival in Montreal or Trois-Rivières to the UQTR campus. These bilingual guides, employed by UQTR, are assigned to the Montreal airport (Montreal-Trudeau), to the train station (Dorval station) as well as to the Trois-Rivières bus station, in the morning and in the afternoon (depending on the participants' arrival times). They are responsible for managing arrival logistics and shuttle service to UQTR. Our guides will carry a sign and two identity cards bearing photographs, so that participants can identify them, as well as a list of participants' names.

At the end of the session, participants are accompanied either to the airport, the train station or the bus station. Our guides ensure that the participants have checked in their luggage, are familiar with the boarding pass and gate number details, and they remain with the participants until they have gone through the boarding area or have taken their seats on the train or the bus.

Lodging

Participants are housed in [student residences](#) on campus, close to the main buildings where most of the activities are held.



Each apartment has four bedrooms and a shared kitchen, a living room and a bathroom. All the bedrooms have a single bed (provided with pillows and bedding), a desk and a closet. A telephone is available in each apartment. The students share their apartment with other participants of the same gender and program. Boys and girls are lodged on different floors, and there are also monitors on each floor.

Washing machines and dryers are available in the basement of each student residence, at a cost of about \$1.50 per use. Internet access is available in all bedrooms.

Security

A curfew comes into force at 9:30 p.m. every evening, except for certain weekend activities. Monitors stay in the residences with the students and they ensure the tranquility and the safety of the premises 24 hours a day. In addition, security guards assigned to the residences make regular rounds.

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
