12.6	32.5	Fine-grained, medium dark green, talcose, quartz-hornblende andesite. Some epidote and zoisite developed along fracture-fillings and locally in small nests. Calcite fracture-fillings. Occasional pyrite specks.
32.5	38.0	Fine-grained, medium green andesite, with considerable hornblende developed. Epidote developed in fracture-fillings and nests. Slightly sheared at an angle of 50° with the core axis. Occasional pyrite specks. 35.4 - 35.5) Very fine-grained, medium green, dyke rock of 36.4 - 36.6) andesitic composition; the sharp contacts are 37.0 - 37.1) slightly chilled 37.3 - 37.4)

89.8	119.0	Fine-grained, medium light green andesite, with some hornblende developed. Occasional epidote and zoisite fracture-fillings. Sparse pyrite specks. The andesite appears to have been subjected to great heat. In the broken material, there appear a few small pieces of dyke material, similar to 61.7 - 69.1. 88.5 - 90.5 core ground 92.0 - 93.0 " " 104.0 - 106.0 " " 111.0 - 116.0 " " Poor core recovery in the remainder.
