

<b>NLNU SPLIT CLASSES</b>	<b>DESCRIPTIONS</b>
Registered Nurse I	Provides nursing care for patients in a hospital setting.
Registered Nurse IC	Provides nursing care for patients in an area of specialization typically found in ICU/CCU, Emergency, Operating Room, and Labour and Delivery performing comprehensive nursing skills at an advanced level of expertise and autonomy.
Registered Nurse IB	Provides nursing care to Long Term Care facility for residents, often as the sole nurse in charge for a site of a multi-site organization to oversee the care of residents with varying levels of requirements, physical and/or mental diagnoses, and performing bargaining level supervision to non-professional nursing and support staff and possibly other nurses.
Registered Nurse IIC	Co-ordinator. Provides co-ordination/supervision of professional standards of nursing care for a unit, program, or a specialized service.
Registered Nurse II	Patient Education. Provides patient education, and consultation for a specialized service or program.
Registered Nurse IID	Provides regional leadership in the planning, coordination, implementation, and evaluation of a Wound and Skin Care Program.
Psychiatric Registered Nurse IIB	Co-ordination. Provides co-ordination/supervision of professional standards of psychiatric nursing care for a unit, program, or a specialized service.
Psychiatric Registered Nurse II	Coordinates the professional standards of psychiatric nursing care for a unit, program, or a specialized service and provides some development and leadership responsibilities such as on the job training, guidance, and orientation of new staff and students.

Psychiatric Registered Nurse IID	Provides advanced consulting expertise and education of professional standards of psychiatric nursing care, and conducts research and advanced practice to develop, implement, and evaluate practices, processes, and treatment plans for the effective, safe and therapeutic care of patients with mental health issues in a non-mental health acute care setting.
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
