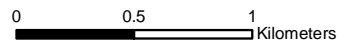
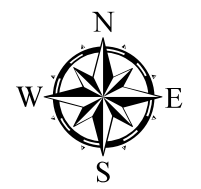

DISTRICTS 09 & 12 – DOMESTIC CUTTING PERMIT CONDITIONS

SOFTWOOD AND HARDWOOD AREAS

Additional Domestic Cutting Permit Conditions – Pursuant to Section 28(f) of The Forestry Act

1. Map(s), conditions and the “Guide to Domestic Woodcutting” must be attached to Permit.
2. All species may be cut in your **approved** cutting areas.
3. No logging debris (tops, limbs, sawdust, etc.) shall be deposited in, or allowed to enter in or on any pond, brook, roadway, or ditch.
4. **No cutting within 30 meters of a permanent water body** or as otherwise specified on cutting permit map.
5. **No cutting within 20 meters** of a NLSF Licenced **snowmobile trail**. (20 meters from edge of trail).
6. **No cutting within 100 meters** of the Provincial Trailway and **30 meters** of Registered Trails.
7. Permittee will remove daily all associated garbage, (plastic oil/gas containers, lunch material, etc.) from the cutting area.
8. Roadside harvesting of DEAD AND/OR BLOWN DOWN timber ONLY, is permitted within 100 meters of the centerline of any routed highway, within Forest Management Districts 09 and 12. **Roadside cutting of living green timber is NOT PERMITTED.**

The Following is Provided for Information Purposes:

1. The attached “Guide to Domestic Woodcutting” is a component of the Environmental Management System certification – ISO 14001:2015. This brochure has been developed to provide domestic woodcutters with an overview of their responsibilities under the system and should be reviewed by all permit holders.
2. Permittee shall not cut in areas designated as no cutting areas or in silviculturally treated areas. Section 9 Cutting of Timber Regulations.
3. Permittee shall not cut in areas designated as Protected Water Supply areas. Section 9 Cutting of Timber Regulations.
4. Permittee shall harvest all timber suitable for sawlogs as sawlogs. Section 14 Cutting of Timber Regulations.
5. Permittee shall not harvest immature timber. Section 17 Cutting of Timber Regulations.

Definitions

1. **Silviculturally treated areas** – Areas of forest land that have been artificially planted or mechanically treated. i.e. thinned areas.
 2. **Saw log** – A portion of a tree that will scale 12 centimeters (5 in) or more inside bark and will measure 2.5 meters (8 ft) or more in length.
 3. **Immature Tree** – A tree having a diameter outside bark of less than 9 centimeters at a point 1.3 meters above ground level and is less than 40 years of age when measured at the same point.
 4. **Blown Down Timber**: Tree(s) that are leaning at an angle greater than 45 degrees and the tree’s roots have been severed on one or more sides and are visibly out of the ground (root collar is visibly broken).
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
