**UPDATE ON THE 2017 FOREST INSECT CONTROL PROGRAM**

**MESSAGE:**

The Department of Fisheries and Land Resources – Forestry and Wildlife Branch wishes to advise that the aircraft to be used for the 2017 hemlock looper control program arrived in Newfoundland yesterday.

Testing and calibration of this aircraft is being conducted at the Stephenville airport today. Weather permitting testing will include the aerial treatment of a test block with water only in the Landowns Pond area.

Once testing and calibration is completed, weather permitting this aircraft will be repositioned to the Port au Choix airstrip in preparation for the start of the 2017 control program. Further information will be provided as available.

Protection of forest areas scheduled for treatment will commence once areas are biologically ready for treatment and logistics and weather conditions permit. Treatments are predicted to begin between Friday, July 21<sup>st</sup> and Tuesday, July 25<sup>th</sup>.
