2019 Community Garden Support Program

Program Overview

The Community Garden Support Program was launched in April 2019 by the Department of Fisheries and Land Resources with the objectives to:

- Increase food self-sufficiency;
- Increase access to fresh foods;
- Increase consumption of fruits and vegetables; and
- Increase awareness and appreciation of the importance of local food production and the agriculture sector.

The Department of Fisheries and Land Resources budgeted \$100,000 in 2019-20 to establish new community gardens and enhance existing community gardens throughout the province. The Community Garden Support Program contributed to The Way Forward – Agriculture Sector Work Plan and the goal to increase food self-sufficiency to at least 20 per cent by 2022 in Newfoundland and Labrador. The program increased awareness and appreciation of the importance of local food production and the agriculture sector.



Community groups, organizations, municipalities and local service districts were eligible to receive up to \$500 annually in a non-repayable grant for food production activities. Eligible project costs included operating and minor capital costs required to establish new community gardens, or maintain and expand existing community gardens within the province.

Funding was used to purchase seed, fertilizer, limestone, soil, vegetable plants

and fruit trees, small tools, watering systems, construction materials for raised beds and greenhouses, garden signage and compost.

The department received 106 applications and approved 101 eligible applicants (see attached listing) for a total investment of \$50,486. The Community Garden Support Program invested in the establishment of 23 new community gardens and enhanced 78 existing community gardens. Applicants reported that more than 3,500 people participated and benefited from the community gardens including youth, seniors, and Indigenous groups.

School gardens were used for educational purposes to teach children about how their food is grown. Other community gardens were able to expand and increase the number of gardeners growing their own food, creating a better appreciation and awareness of local food production and food security. Communities benefited from increased access to fresh and nutritious locally grown foods.

The Town of Humber Arm South, on behalf of the Humber Arm South 50+ Club, used the program funding to purchase compost, fertilizer, limestone, transplants, seeds, small garden tools and row cover and hose to construct hoop houses to grow vegetables.



Gardeners grew squash, peppers, tomatoes, and carrots. The president of the Humber Arm 50+ Club, Maureen Parsons, noted that "There was increased social interaction, increased physical activity, increased gardening knowledge and at least one good crop of carrots." The garden was established "to increase seniors intake of fresh fruit and vegetables, share gardening expertise and increase awareness of local food production."

The Rabbittown Community Centre in St. John's used the funding to purchase seeds, seedlings, soil and fertilizer. Fifty people were involved throughout the summer and fall and grew many different crops including potatoes, carrots, onions, peppers, leeks, peas, rhubarb, cabbage, pumpkin, squash and zucchini.

The Flat Bay Band Inc. on the west coast of the island had 11 youth tend their community garden throughout the summer and they successfully grew potatoes, carrots, turnip, asparagus, and fruits such as apples, plums, and strawberries. The harvest was distributed through vegetable baskets to seniors in the community and remaining vegetables will be used in a community feast in late October.

Funding for the 2019-20 Community Garden Support Program was sourced from the Provincial Agrifoods Assistance Program.
