Rationale

- No guidelines or strategy currently in place in the province
- Limited information on exotic species in the province
- Further understanding of the impacts
- Determine the rate at which species are expanding into new areas
- Update and expand the exotic species inventory

International Conventions

 Organization des Epizooties, and International
 Maritime Organization
- National Commitments
 - National IAS Strategy
 - Provincial commitments outlined in strategy

Approach

- Draft strategy to be developed

Goal

To monitor the presence, abundance, and range of exotic and invasive alien species in the province. In addition, monitoring of introduction "hot spots" will occur to aid in preventing any additional exotic arrivals
