I aint no Wade Locke but I know how to balance a budget. I have been in small business most of my life and one of the most challenging was the fishery where prices varied from year to year. Weather and catch rates played a big factor in the bottom line. By managing prudently I have succeeded in surviving and providing for my family without leaving any debt for my family when I pass on But my children, grand children and great grandchildren will be paying for the rest of their lives the debt that the Government are passing on to them and a projected 5 year deficit will only add to their burden.

Government should take a lesson from the fishing industry in bad times watch the spending and in good times put some away for when things are Not Good.
