Newfoundland and Labrador Paramedicine Regulation (NLPR)

Jurisprudence Declaration

The following are the jurisprudence items of responsibility and expectations as a Paramedicine provider licenced with NLPR. *Please check* ($\sqrt{}$) *each item as confirmation of awareness and understanding for each criteria listed:*

Licensure is required with NLPR for a Critical Care Paramedic (CCP), Advanced Care Paramedic (ACP), Primary Care Paramedic (PCP), Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) or Medical First Responder (MFR) when practicing in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.	
Title usage of CCP, ACP, PCP, EMR or MFR only when licenced with NLPR in the province.	
Paramedicine providers require medical authorization when licenced in order to practice.	
Paramedicine providers require coverage through liability insurance when employed in a clinical setting.	
Each provider:	
Must disclose any breach in patient information pertaining to the Oath of Confidentiality.	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the Paramedicine Regulation Policies.	
Must disclose and provide any documentation to NLPR surrounding criminal charges and/or convictions.	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the Newfoundland & Labrador Occupational Health & Safety Regulations pertaining to work-related duties as specified in Sections: (52-54; 56-58).	
Must acquire and maintain a NL Class (4) driver's licence according to the <i>Highway Traffic Act</i> if operating an ambulance in the province. This includes obtaining knowledge and understanding of the Act pertaining to ambulance operations specified in Ch. V; Rules of the Road: Sections: (121-123).	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the <i>Road Ambulance Policies and Procedures Manual</i> within thirty days of employment with a publicly subsidized ambulance service.	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA).	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the <i>Ambulance Operations Standards Manual</i> within thirty days of employment with a publicly subsidized ambulance service.	
Must obtain knowledge and understanding of the Gunshot and Stab Wound Reporting Act.	
Must be proficient in the English language in accordance to the <i>Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada</i> definition of high proficiency and provide proof upon request to NLPR, if applicable.
