To whom it may concern:

_____ has a chronic medical condition called hypogammaglobulinemia, or the inability to produce immunoglobulins within his/her body. This condition, if untreated, would leave him/her susceptible to infection. The condition is treated by lifelong injections of replacement immunoglobulins in the form of a medication called subcutaneous immune globulin (SCIG), which is manufactured from human blood.

To maintain sufficient levels of immunoglobulins, patients must take this medication and the equipment required to self-administer it with them when traveling. This product must be stored at a controlled temperature and the following items will need to be carried onto the airplane by the above named individual.

- SCIG vials
- Syringes
- Needles
- Administration sets
- Alcohol swabs
- Gauze and tape
- Medication to manage side-effects (non-drowsy anti-histamine and over-the-counter pain medication)
- A container and possible gel packs (required to keep SCIG and other medications at the correct temperature during travel)
