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TO: ALL FEE-FOR-SERVICE PHYSICIANS

RE: CANADIAN MEDICAL PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION (CMPA) REBATE ON 2019 MEMBERSHIP FEES

The Department of Health & Community Services will be providing a subsidy to **fee-for-service** physicians who incurred an expense for CMPA membership fees in 2019. To qualify, a physician must have been in active practice at the end of the calendar year, or have retired from clinical services during the year.

Fee-for-service physicians will be reimbursed the difference between what they paid and sixty percent of the basic Family Physician CMPA membership fee (type of work code 35). Sixty percent of the FP basic for 2019 (\$2,712.00) equates to \$1,627.20, therefore, the CMPA rebate for a Family Physician would be \$1,084.80 (\$2,712.00-\$1,627.20 = \$1,084.80).

For example, a fee-for-service obstetrician who was in active practice on December 31, 2019 and paid a membership fee of 28,704.00 (Code 93) in 2019 will be reimbursed 27,076.80 (28,704.00 less the 1,627.20 ($0.6 \times 2,712.00$ basic FP Rate)=27,076.80). In effect, all fee-for-service physicians, following receipt of their rebate, will have paid a maximum membership fee of 1,627.20.

The Department is continuing its partnership with the CMPA, so all reimbursement information will be sent to us electronically by the CMPA. This eliminates the need for you to mail your original 2019 CMPA Acknowledgement to the Department. Please note that additional costs incurred through payment via the instalment method are not eligible for reimbursement.

Subsidy reimbursement can be expected with the March 25, 2020 Medical Care Plan payment. If the payment is delayed for technical reasons, it will be made on the earliest subsequent payment date.
