

# **GERMAN MEASLES (RUBELLA)**

#### **Disease/Incubation Period**

Incubation Period: 1 - 4 weeks (usually 2 weeks) **Reportable Highly Contagious** 

#### How To Recognize

Mild cold symptoms, swelling of glands in neck followed 5 – 10 days later by a red rash.

## How It Spreads

Contact with discharge from the nose and throat of an infected person. Directly from person to person or indirectly by handling contaminated articles.

## When It Is Contagious

From 1 week before to at least 4 days after onset of rash.

## What To Do At Home

- Rest, increase fluids. Careful disposal of used tissues.
- Avoid contact with pregnant women. (Rubella can be dangerous to unborn babies).
- If necessary use acetaminophen (Tempra, Tylenol) for fever. Aspirin is not recommended.
- Frequent handwashing.
- Hot water washing of contaminated articles.
- Call a Public Health Nurse.

## What To Do At School

- Child must not attend until at four days after rash appears
- Any staff who are pregnant should check with doctor or Public Health Nurse to determine whether they have immunity to this disease.
- Notify Public Health Unit/Community Health Agency as un-immunized child will need to be offered immunization.
