



Wait Time Information - Colorectal Cancer Surgery

Q: What is Cancer Surgery?

Cancer surgery is an operation to repair or remove part of the body in the treatment of cancer.

Q: Who goes on a wait list?

Anyone who needs a treatment that has a wait list is placed on the list, unless it is an emergency. Emergency patients are treated as quickly as possible.

Q: What is Colorectal Cancer Surgery?

Colorectal cancer surgery is an operation to repair or remove part of the group of cancers found in the area of the small or large intestine and rectum for cancer.

Q: Where will I be referred to have this surgery?

Q: How are wait times measured?

For this operation, the wait time is measured from when you and your surgeon decide to proceed with surgery for the confirmed cancer to when the procedure is completed.

Q: What is the benchmark wait time for cancer surgery?

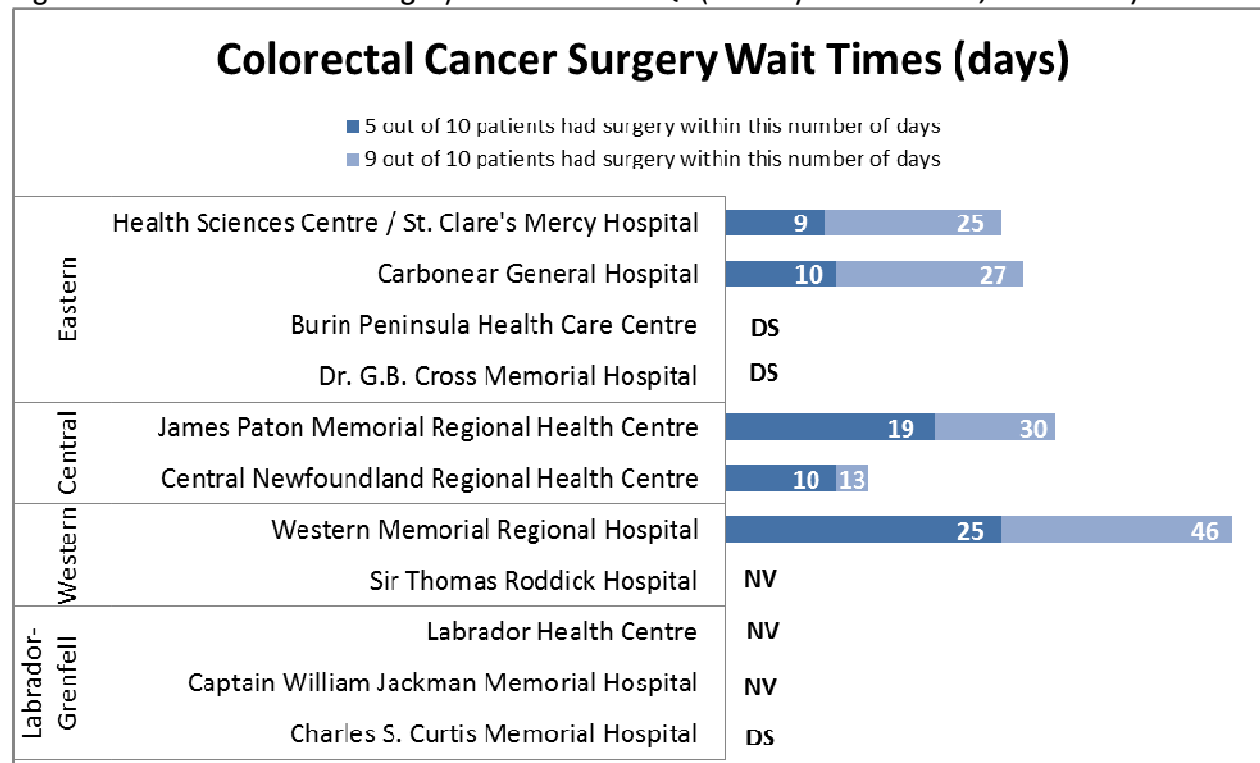
