Activities for 2005

The Matty Mitchell Prospectors Resource Room project, currently in its seventh year of operation, continued to supply mentoring, technical support and promotional assistance to prospectors across Newfoundland and Labrador.

In 2005, the Resource Room provided in excess of one hundred individual clients, on multiple visits, with on-site information and consultation services, including rock and mineral identification, help with data interpretation and presentation, and technical advice. Others were assisted via telephone and/or email consultations and through

other efforts. The current strength of the mining and exploration sector led to ever-increasing demands on our resources in 2005. It was a busy but rewarding year in which we saw many clients successfully shepherd prospects through the discovery-promotion-optioning process.

The Resource Room supplied property promotional services and technical and logistical support to clients at the 2005 PDAC, Exploration Roundup and CIMM trade shows. We developed, displayed and distributed prospector property posters and Properties for Option maps,

booklets and CD-ROMs, and joined with the Survey in developing promotional and regional technical posters for these major industry conferences. The Resource Room

helped prospectors to follow up contacts made at the industry conferences. Once again, we participated in a number of public outreach initiatives across the province. In providing this support and information, the Matty Mitchell Room worked in close collaboration with the Newfoundland and Labrador Chamber of Mineral Resources, with additional support from the Mineral Development Division of the Department of Natural Resources.



major new initiative was launched in 2005 to promote prospecting throughout the province. The Matty Mitchell Room partnered with the Chamber of Mineral Resources to deliver a series of free prospecting workshops in regional centres across Newfoundland and Labrador. The one-day sessions were held in Clarenville, Marystown, Gander, Grand Falls-Windsor, St. Albans, Harbour Breton, Port-aux-Basques, Stephenville, Corner Brook, Wabush-Labrador City, Happy Valley-Goose Bay and St. John's. The initial round of seminars, delivered by geologists Nathaniel Noel and Larry Hicks, were well-attended by a wide cross-section of the population and received rave reviews.

Preliminary discussions are ongoing to develop a second series of seminars and workshops, which will target other rural areas. 
