1. Overview

Section 7 of the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area Regulations under the Lands Act provides for the appointment of an appeal board to hear appeals of the decisions of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority. The Appeal Board, also known as the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board, is to be appointed by the Minister. The Board must have at least three members.

The Appeal Board membership includes: Mr. Peter Morris, Chairperson; Mr. Brian Murphy, Member; Mr. Cyril Power Member; and Mr. Jan van de Hulst, Member.

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board receives extensive operational support from the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency. Employees of the Agency perform many day to day administrative functions. Budgetary support for operations is also provided through the Agency.

2. Mandate

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board was established to hear appeals of the decisions of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority concerning applications to carry out development on land in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area as defined by the *Lands Act* and specifically the *St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area Regulations*. The Board may recommend that the Minister of Natural Resources uphold, reverse or vary a decision of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority and record in a minute book the attendance and proceedings of the board at all appeal hearings.

3. Core Values and Guiding Principles

The following are the core values and guiding principles of the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board and are closely linked to those of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency:

Integrity - Each individual will be honest, dependable, fair, credible and trustworthy. They will openly acknowledge mistakes, seek to correct them and learn from them.

Respect and Professionalism - Each individual will apply legislation and policies equitably and will serve the Board's client groups to the fullest extent possible.

Collaboration - Each individual will seek the opinions and ideas of others in the application of legislation and policies.

Innovation - Each individual will demonstrate initiative and flexibility in responding to challenges and change.

Safety - Each individual views the personal safety of themselves and co-workers in the highest regard and will promote workplace safety at all times.

Productive – Each individual will maximize their productivity and efficiency in carrying out their duties.

Timely – Each individual will conduct their duties in a timely manner and meet all established deadlines.

Diligence - Each individual will be careful and persistent in the application or effort made in respect to the regulations and policies

4. Primary Clients

The clients of the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board are individuals or organizations who apply through the municipal councils of the City of St. John's, Town of Portugal Cove-St. Philip's, Town of Pouch Cove, Town of Flatrock, Town of Torbay, Town of Logy Bay-Middle Cove-Outer Cove, and the Town of Conception Bay South to carry out development on land in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area and wish to appeal a decision of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority.

5. Vision

Through assessment of appeals of applications for opportunities to carry out development on land in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area, the Agriculture Appeal Board contributes to the vision of the Department of Natural Resources, stated as follows:

"The vision of the Department of Natural Resources is a province that realizes the full benefit from the sustainable development of its natural resources."

6. Mission

The mission statement is the priority focus area of a public body over its planning cycle. It represents the key longer term result that the public body and the responsible minister will work towards to achieve a component of government's strategic directions. The statement also identifies the measures and indicators that will assist a public body and the public in monitoring and evaluating success.

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board has determined that an applicable mission statement would be unduly repetitive of its mandate. It has opted to forgo development of a mission statement at this time.

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board considered its role in assisting the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency in achieving its mission for the planning period. The Board has a role in strengthening and sustaining the agriculture resource by making recommendations on appeals for land development in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area. As such, aspects of the following general statement from the mission of the Agency related to agriculture and agrifoods sectors apply to the Board:

By March 31, 2017, the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency will have supported programs and services to strengthen and sustain forestry, agriculture and agrifoods industry development in an innovative and economically beneficial manner".

The purpose of the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board is to review appeals of decisions of the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority, which is responsible for the review of development applications within the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area, where agriculture and agriculture land are protected. It is clear that the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board is supportive of the mission of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency in respect to sustainable development of the province's agrifoods resource.

The Board has determined that it has no material impact on achievement of measures and indicators of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency's mission statement.

The complete mission of the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency is found in its Strategic Plan for the period covering April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2014.

8. Objectives

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board reviews appeals of decisions made by the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority. All appeals are given due consideration under the regulations. The Board makes a recommendation to the Minister.

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board considered the Strategic Directions of the Minister of Natural Resources to work towards the sustainability of agribusiness. The Appeal Board also recognized the directions of the Minister to support industry development, expansion and promotion.

The following area has been identified as the key priority of the Board for the three year period April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2014. The objective below applies to each year covered by this plan and will be reported on in relevant annual reports.

- Issue 1: Developments on Land in the St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Development Area
- **Objective**: The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board will have reviewed all appeals of decisions by the St. John's Land Development Advisory Authority under the applicable Act and Regulations.
- Measure: Reviewed all appeals

Indicators:

- Reviewed appeals and made recommendations to the Minister of Natural Resources
- Recorded minutes of proceedings

9. Appendix A: Strategic Directions

Strategic directions are the articulation of desired physical, social or economic outcomes and normally require action by more than one government entity. These directions are generally communicated by government through platform documents, Throne and Budget Speeches, policy documents and other communiqués. The Transparency and Accountability Act requires departments and public bodies to take into account these strategic directions in the preparation of their performance-based plans. This action will facilitate the integration of planning practices across government and will ensure that all entities are moving forward on key commitments.

The St. John's Urban Region Agriculture Appeal Board considered the Strategic Directions of the Minister responsible for the Forestry and Agrifoods Agency in preparation of its April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2014 Activity Plan.
