

# **NLPNP International Graduate Step-by-Step Process**

#### 1. Job Offer

TEER level 0, 1, 2, 3, or 4 (TEER 4 must be an <u>in-demand occupation</u>) are eligible under the NLPNP International Graduate category.

Candidates must hold a valid <u>IRCC Post-Graduation work permit (PGWP)</u> that has at least four (4) months validity remaining at the time of application for the NLPNP.

#### 2. Field of Study Requirement

Candidates under the International Graduate category should hold a full-time position that is related to their field of study from the post-secondary program they completed in Canada.

<u>Out-of-province gradautes</u> must work for a minimum of one year in Newfoundland and Labrador prior to submitting their NLPNP application, and are required to hold a full-time position related to their field of study.

Graduates of Memorial University or College of the North Atlantic are exempted from the field of study requirement, provided the position meets all of the criteria as detailed in: <u>International Graduate Eligibility</u> <u>Criteria - 8. #### 2. Submit NLPNP Application

<u>Candidate</u> submits online NLPNP application to the Office of Immigration and Multiculturalism <u>International</u> <u>Graduate</u> Category.

#### 4. Permanent Residency Application

If successfully nominated by the province, the <u>candidate</u> also submits a permanent residency application to <u>IRCC.</u>

## 5. Work Permit Application (if required)

If successfully nominated by the province, the candidate can apply for a provincially supported work permit to ensure they maintain valid status throughout the entire processing of permanent residence application.

### 6. Become a Permanent Resident of Canada

Settle in Newfoundland and Labrador.
