Labour Market Partnerships

Description

The Labour Market Partnerships program is designed to encourage, support and facilitate labour force adjustments and human resource planning activities that are in the public interest. The program provides funding to encourage and support employers, employee/employer associations and communities in developing and implementingstrategies for responding to labour force adjustments and meeting human resource requirements. Funding is provided through the Canada – Newfoundland and Labrador Labour Market Development Agreement (LMDA).

Eligibility Information

Businesses, organizations, municipalities, band/tribal councils, public health and educational institutions are eligible to receive funding as sponsors.

Proposed activities must focus on an identified labour market issue and be assessed as likely to have a positive impact on the labour market.

Labour Market Partnerships may support activities related to human resource planning and labour force adjustment. Activities can include related research, development of human resource strategies, promotion of beneficial human resource and adjustment practices (best practices), coordination of community-based approaches to addressing labour market issues, short-term adjustment services for workers facing layoff and the creation of economic (employment) development plans and community marketing plans.

Activities must have defined start and finish dates, and not be part of a sponsor's day-to-day operations.

All activities must involve partnership. Other criteria may apply.

How To Apply?

All employers or organizations applying to the program must first register with the department's LaMPSS system through a one-time registration process at: https://www.gov.nl.ca/ipgs/employer-registration/

Once registration is complete, a password and user ID will be provided. This enables organizations to apply for and monitor all departmental program agreements online.

Financial Benefits

Financial assistance must be for a finite period of time and for a specific activity directly related to the approved activities of the project.

Funding may be provided to cover overhead costs such as wages and employment costs, research or technical studies, and other related costs and eligible expenses negotiated with program officials.
