Cardiac – if clinical or objective diagnosis of heart disease, the N.Y.H.A as follows:

Class I no symptoms, no limitation with ordinary physical activity & comfortable at rest

Class II mild symptoms, slight limitation with ordinary activity & comfortable at rest

Class III marked limitation in activity, even with less-than ordinary activity; comfortable only at rest

Class IV severe limitations, symptoms even while at rest

A period based assessment by a cardiologist is required for professional drivers.

Vision Standards - corrected or uncorrected VA & Fields with both eyes open & examined together.

Class 5: VA = 20/50 (6/15) or > & fields 120 or >

Class 4 Taxi: VA = 20/40 (6/12) or >; worse eye 20/200 (6/60) or > & fields 120 or >

Class 1, 2, 3 4 (Emergency): Acuity 20/30 (6/9) or >; worse eye 20/100 (6/30) or > & fields are 150 or >

Aneurysm of the Aorta - Vascular Surgeon's opinion may be required. If surgery done & recovery satisfactory, may be permitted to apply for/retain any Class of licence.

Eligible if the aneurysm or dissection is not at the stage of imminent rupture as determined by size, location or recent change. Class 5 - Men - <6.5 cm; Women - <6 cm. Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 - Men <6; Women < 5.5 cm.

Epilepsy - If seizure free for 6 months, compliant with medication and under regular medical care, may hold a Class 5. If seizure free on/off medication for 5 years and/or receives a favourable report from the usual/treating Neurologist/Physican, may hold any Class of licence.

Neurological/MSK Disorders - description of functional limitations required.

Diabetes - commercial drivers treated with insulin MUST maintain a log of their blood sugars.

Respiratory Conditions - if on supplemental oxygen or experiencing cognitive issues may be required to have an on road assessment of driving skills.

CLASS OF DRIVERS LICENCES

Class 1 - Semi-trailer and Tractor trailer combinations

Class 2 - Buses (more than 24 passengers)

Class 3 - Trucks with 3 or more axles

Class 4 - Taxis, Buses (</24 passengers), Emergency Vehicles and Ambulances

Class 5 - Private Vehicles

Class 6 - Motorcycles or Mopeds
