#### INTEGRATED MUNICIPAL SUSTAINABILITY PLAN AMENDMENT MP16-08

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Municipal Plan Amendment MP16-08 is required in order to correct the hatch pattern (shading) used for portions of the coastal buffer as delineated on the Integrated Municipal Sustainability Plan, Map D - Environmentally Sensitive Areas Map. A review of Map D has shown that the hatch (shading) pattern for some portions of the coastal buffer do not match the established pattern for all portions of the buffer; therefore it must be corrected.

The proper hatch for the coastal buffer consists of gray shading, selected to purposely differentiate this area from other areas along the coast, and inland of the buffer, that do not have shading. The areas requiring a change to gray shading currently have a dashed line pattern, selected during the development stages of Map D. The proposed action is not associated with any development application but discovered as a result of intermittent mapping review.

For clarity and interpretation purposes, the gray shade to be applied to those areas currently missing the shading will be achieved using a gray line hatch in some of the areas being corrected, so as not to obscure other information on the map identifying areas of steep slope in excess of 20% or 33%, in some of the same locations where the coastal buffer area is identified.

### **PUBLIC CONSULTATION:**

During the preparation of this amendment, Council advertised the proposed amendment in the Western Star newspaper on July 30 and August 6, 2016 which advised of Council's intention to seek the said amendment to its Municipal Plan. In addition to this, the proposed amendment was posted on the City's website and was available for viewing at City Hall.

There were no responses in relation to the public notice regarding this amendment

#### AMENDMENT:

The Integrated Municipal Sustainability Plan 2012 Map D, Environmentally Sensitive Areas, will hereby be amended by changing the affected areas, as identified on the attached copy of Map D, to a gray shaded tone or gray line hatch (to achieve the gray shade without obscuring other information related to steep slope identification within some of the same areas).
