Background

The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador intends on constructing a new 10,000m² intermediate level school which will serve approximately 825 students in the Town of Paradise. The school is proposed on lands northeast of the Dianne Whalen Soccer Complex.

The subject site is currently zoned "Commercial General" which does not allow public schools. The purpose of Development Regulations Amendment No. 1, 2018 is to rezone the site from "Commercial General" to "Public Use" to accommodate the proposed intermediate school.

Public Consultation

During the preparation of this amendment, the Town of Paradise published a notice in The Shoreline newspaper on September 26th, 2018 and October 3rd, 2018 advertising Development Regulation Amendment No. 1, 2018. The amendment documents were available at the Paradise Town Hall and on the Town's website for the public to review from September 26th, 2018 to October 11th, 2018, during regular business hours. The Town accepted comments and/or concerns on the proposed changes in writing until 4:30pm, Thursday, October 11th, 2018. No comments or objections were received.

Holyrood awards lift station contract

Holyrood proved a contract Tuesday evening that should result in fewer noxious nights next summer when the weather turns sultry and the mercury rises along the main beach.

Precision Excavating will undertake an upgrade of the Main Beach Lift Station including repairs to the force main, or main sewer line that feeds it

There were complaints several times this past summer about a smell of sewer-

age in the area of the station, which is located on the main road near the town's post office

Councillor Jim Joy, who heads council's infrastructure and public works committee, served up the motion to award the contract.

'One of the outstanding infrastructure projects which council has been working on for the last couple of years is the Main Beach Lift Station," allowed Joy. "Problems associated with the partially blocked force main have

been causing discharge resulting in very undesirable odours in the area. Adding to this were problems associated with the operation of the treatment plant. A main piece of equipment at the plant has been upgraded and I'm very pleased to say work associated with the lift station and force main will soon begin... It's certainly good news and I'm sure the concerned residents in the area, and the town, will be pleased

In an interview after the

meeting, Joy reckoned the lift station dates back to the 1970s. It serves as the main pump for sewerage emanating from homes in the Refinery Road area of town to a treatment plant on Byrne's Road along the beach. North Arm has a separate sewerage

"It (the Main Beach Lift Station) doesn't handle all the town, but it handles a fair portion of all the wastewater in the town," Joy said.

Paradise taking privacy commissioner to court

The Town of Paradise has opted to fight a ruling by the province's information

and privacy commissioner regarding the use of surveillance cameras at Town facilities and will go to court on Friday to seek a date to present its case.

Mayor Dan Bobbett said ouncil decided in its committee-of-the-whole, or privileged meeting, Tuesday to instruct its lawyers to defend missioner's order to remove many of its surveillance it."

"We've been working with the privacy commissioner, as we said before, and we want to move through the process," said Bobbett, "There were a couple of extensions on both sides, but now we are saying we are going to proceed with the legal part

"We look at this way," added Bobbett, "we employ those cameras because we've had break-ins, we've had vandalism and we're looking at the protection of our assets, plus our staff and the people who use our buildings. I've said it before and I'll say it again, if you're not doing anything wrong you shouldn't have to worry about the cameras. They are there for the protection of everybody."

Bobbett reckoned

about Town has spent \$200,000 on its cameras and security system, including the software and other components that go with it. The Town used to have full time security guards working around the clock. "Those things cost a lot more money," he argued. "We've got assets here in the town worth the Town against the com- millions and millions of dollars and you've got to protect

The issue of Pardise's surveillance program arose in April when the privacy commissioner, Donovan Molloy, filed a report saying the Town didn't have justification for some of the cameras it operates at the Double Ice Complex. He accused the Town of collecting personal information in some cases. The Town has a total of 93 cameras throughout its facil-

Bobbett said the commissioner said there has to be justification for each and every camera.

"For instance, if we had a camera on this corner of the building and nothing happened out there, then we had no justification for the camera (according to the commissioner)," said Bobbett.
"But if we had the camera on this (a different) corner of the building and there was a break-in at the Rovers' (building) - and there was a couple of times and we had break-ins to our yard on this side - then that one was okay. It doesn't make sense. You're putting them there as a deterrent. We don't want anyone breaking-in on this side or that side and these are the deterrents. That's what's it's about, that's why we have cameras in strategic locations, around doors, around entrances. There are none actually showing work

The only exceptions, added chief administrative officer Lisa Niblock, is where the safe is kept and in place where there are hazardous materials


