Taking action on drinking water safety is a priority of the Provincial Government. Access to clean and safe drinking water is fundamental to human health and the economic sustainability of our communities. The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador is seeking input to help inform a Drinking Water Safety Action Plan for the province. The development of this Action Plan is being led by the Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC) in partnership with other Departments including Health and Community Services, Digital Government and Service NL, Transportation and Infrastructure, and Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

To help make informed decisions, the ECC is seeking feedback from stakeholders on:

- Baseline awareness of drinking water issues in the province;
- Identifying which issues are seen as a priority; and
- Identifying and prioritizing actions to be taken to help address these issues.
