<sup>1</sup>**Non-profit organizations** must be incorporated entities that are registered as either a non-profit or a charity, in accordance with applicable federal and/or provincial statutes. <sup>2</sup> For-profit organizations must work in collaboration with one or more of the following:

- i. Any of the other entities specifically identified under Type of Recipient (i.e. not including "Other");
- ii. the Provincial Government; or,
- iii. an Indigenous government.

<sup>3</sup>**Post-secondary intuitions** must work in collaboration with a municipality, and be public or not-for-profit institutions that are directly or indirectly authorized, under the terms of provincial or federal statute, or royal charter, to deliver post-secondary courses or programs that lead to recognized and transferable post-secondary credentials.

<sup>4</sup> Indigenous recipients include the following:

- i. A band council within the meaning of section 2 of the Indian Act;
- A First Nation, Inuit or Métis government or authority established pursuant to a self-government agreement or a comprehensive land claim agreement between Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada and an Indigenous people of Canada, that has been approved, given effect and declared valid by federal legislation;
- iii. A First Nation, Inuit or Métis government that is established by or under legislation whether federal or provincial that incorporates a governance structure; and
- A not-for-profit organization whose central mandate is to improve Indigenous outcomes, working in collaboration with one or more of the Indigenous entities referred to above, a municipality, or Newfoundland and Labrador.

<sup>5</sup> **Public sector bodies** must be established by or under provincial statute or by regulation or be wholly-owned by the Provincial Government, or a municipal or regional government.
